## ANNUAL ENROLLMENT REPORT

The total unduplicated headcount for the fall 2021 term in all sectors of Arkansas higher education, including public universities, public colleges, private/independent colleges and universities, and nursing schools was $\mathbf{1 4 5 , 6 9 5}$ students, representing a decline of $1.1 \%$ from the fall 2020 term.

The last time all sectors of Arkansas higher education experienced an increase in fall term headcount was the fall 2011 term. Fall 2011 total unduplicated headcount of 173,887 represented the largest fall term headcount ever. Declines from year-to-year since the 2011 fall term range from $.5 \%$ to $5.6 \%$. Arkansas higher education currently has 28,192 fewer students than it did in the fall 2011 term.

Of the 145,695 students enrolled in fall 2021, 1,548 students are enrolled at more than one institution and represent one percent of the total fall 2021 headcount.


The following graph depicts a five-year total headcount trend for each sector of Arkansas higher education. Four-year universities and 2-year colleges all experienced an overall decline in headcount, while private/independent institutions and nursing institutions reported an increase.


The 4-year public universities reported a fall term decline for a fifth consecutive year. They experienced their highest headcount in the fall 2016 term of 100,413.


The 2-year public colleges reported a decrease from 2020 of 1.5\%. They experienced their highest headcount in the fall 2012 term of 59,601.


Private/independent colleges reported an increase of 275 students. They experienced their highest headcount in the fall 2015 term of 16,611.


High School student headcount, including both concurrent and dually enrolled students, increased from last year by 1,379 students. Covid-19 is believed to have been a significant factor in the decline in high school headcounts in AY 2020. While high school headcounts in AY 2021 have rebounded over AY 2020, they have not returned to prepandemic enrollment levels. There are 683 high school students enrolled in concurrent courses with more than one institution, which is $3.9 \%$ of the total high school concurrent headcount.


Undergraduate headcount declined by 3.8\%. The largest undergraduate class on record is 142,442 reported in fall 2011 . Undergraduate headcount reported here does not include high school student headcount.


Graduate headcount for all public and private institutions increased for fall 2021 term by 1,095 students representing an increase of $6.7 \%$ from the fall 2020 term.


First-professional headcount has grown each of the last ten years. Headcount includes students in law, medicine, pharmacy, advanced nursing programs, and occupational and physical therapies.


## Public 4-Year Universities Fall Term Headcount Trends

The following chart provides a five-year fall term headcount trend for all public 4-year universities. The two 4-year universities reporting the largest increase in fall term 2021 were UAF with an increase of $5.5 \%$ and UAMS with an increase of $6.2 \%$.

## Public 2-Year College Fall Term Headcount Trends

The following chart provides a five-year fall term headcount trend for all public 2-year colleges. Eight 2 -year colleges reported increases in fall term headcount. ASU-Three Rivers showed $28.5 \%$ growth and Southern Arkansas University Tech showed 21.2\% growth.

## Private/Independent/Nursing - Total Headcount Trends

Seven private/independent and nursing schools reported fall term headcount declines ranging from $-3.7 \%$ to $-12.1 \%$. The remaining eleven schools reported increases ranging from $0.3 \%$ to $31.8 \%$.
