As a result of the grant, a cohort of 50 Pell Grant-eligible ATU students who have children and reside in a five- county region (Pope, Yell, Franklin, Logan and Johnson) will be selected each of the next four years (through September 2022) to receive funding for child care at one of childcare facilities that have agreed to partner with ATU on the initiative. ATU will seek to renew grant in 2022.
