We are acutely aware that state support did not increase for the 2014-15 College year, tuition and fee revenue decreased due to the decrease in enrollment, and yet we have prepared a balanced budget that provides salary increases for our high-quality employees, a renewed commitment to controlling costs and strategic goals for increasing the enrollment at NorthWest Arkansas Community College. We will monitor the enrollment on a regular basis; we will monitor expenses; we will assure that the public is informed of the great quality and affordability of NorthWest Arkansas Community College and we will move confidently into the future, planning strategically to better serve the students of northwest Arkansas communities and the great state of Arkansas.

FY 2014-15 Budget

On April 14, 2014, the NorthWest Arkansas Community College Board of Trustees approved the FY 2014-15 Budget. The objectives of the FY 2014-15 Budget were to ensure financial stability, increase efficiencies and omit redundancies; and to avoid increasing tuition and fees. In spite of a tight budget, NWACC would continue to promote quality and excellence in the achievement of its mission and adherence to the 5-Year Strategic Plan. NWACC divisions and departments accomplished these objectives and a balanced budget was presented to the Board. In addition, NWACC has greatly improved its budgeting process, and has developed additional financial reports and metrics to assure we meet our ongoing obligations and maintain adequate reserves.

The NWACC FY2015 Budget assumptions and highlights are as follows:

- NWACC would target efforts toward increased enrollments.
- NWACC would offer new Board-approved tuition waivers.
- NWACC would offer retirement incentives.
- NWACC would decrease maintenance and operation expenses.
- NWACC would continue faculty step increases.
- NWACC would provide 1% COLA for non-academic staff.
- NWACC would review existing programs for efficiencies.
- NWACC would review unfilled positions.

The FY 2014-15 Budget aligns financial resources with expenditures to provide exemplary support and educational experiences for all students: traditional and non-traditional, credit and non-credit. Though the state has not allocated any new dollars in FY 2014-15, the College continues to be committed to increasing student recruitment, retention, and graduation rates; remaining one of the most desirable employers in northwest Arkansas; fostering diversity; and providing quality services.

RTHWEST ARKANSAS MMUNITY COLLEGE About NorthWest Arkansas Community College

NorthWest Arkansas Community College is a comprehensive, learning-centered twoyear college dedicated primarily to meeting the educational needs of its service area of Benton and Washington counties.

The NorthWest Arkansas Community College District was authorized on August 15, 1989, when voters in the Rogers and Bentonville public school districts approved a 3-mil tax to support the college. The first classes were attended by more than 1,200 students in the fall of 1990 at high schools, chambers of commerce, municipal and leased facilities throughout the district.

Burns Hall, the first permanent learning center, opened its doors to just more than 2,400 students in August 1995. Annually, NorthWest Arkansas Community now serves approximately 19,000 students through its credit courses, concurrent enrollment opportunities for high school students, and offerings in corporate learning, personal enrichment and adult education.

In 2012, the Institutional Actions Council of the Higher Learning Commission, a commission of the North Central Association, granted NorthWest Arkansas Community College continued accreditation through 2019-20. NorthWest Arkansas Community also was reaffirmed as one of the Higher Learning Commission, Academic Quality Improvement Program institutions.
